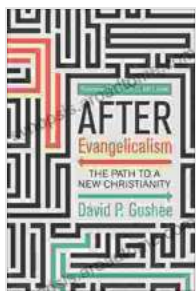


# After Evangelicalism: The Path to a New Christianity

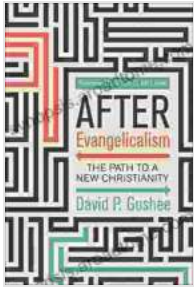

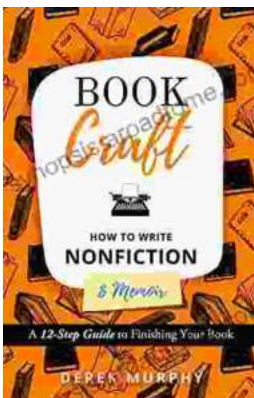
