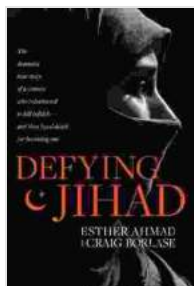

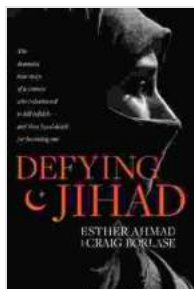
## **Additional Information**

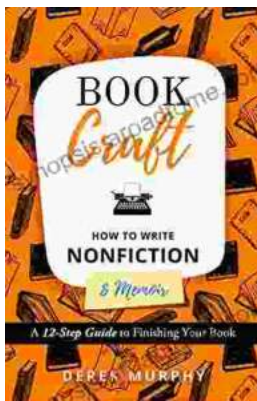
